ABSTRACT

The *Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF)* is an organization presently headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland. The League was established at The Hague, Netherlands in 1915; its name at the time was the *International Committee of Women for Permanent Peace (ICWPP)*. Since that time the organization's members have been involved in diverse issues ranging from human rights to disarmament and virtually everything in between. The Swarthmore College Peace Collection accession of WILPF records, formerly housed at the Swarthmore College Peace Collection in Pennsylvania, is comprised of documents pertaining to the League's activities; including Executive Committee Meetings and Triennial Congresses, internal correspondence and correspondence with outside parties, and documents from WILPF national and branch sections. The dates of these documents range from the League's beginnings in 1915 through the year 2000. However, the majority of the documents are dated in the earlier years of this timeframe.

HISTORY

ORIGINS/DEVELOPMENT

The Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF) was founded in 1915, in The Netherlands, as a response to the war occurring in Europe. One of the organization's goals is to unite women worldwide who oppose oppression and exploitation. In addition, the organization strives to bring together women of different political and philosophical convictions, united in their determination to study and make known and help abolish the political, social, economic and psychological causes of war and to work for a constructive peace. The League is currently represented in approximately 48 countries and holds the distinction of being the oldest continually active peace organization in the United States.

ACTIVITIES/ACHIEVEMENTS

While disarmament has always been a focal point of the organization's activities; members also work on a diverse range of social issues occurring around the world.¹ Members of the organization strive to achieve the widespread adoption of negotiation and reconciliation as the technique for settling conflicts. Further, the organization seeks to resolve international issues by effecting public policy changes.

The many accomplishments of the organization and its members include two Nobel Peace Prize awards. Jane Addams, one of the founders, was the first woman to receive the honor in 1931; Emily Balch received the award in 1946. In addition, Jeannette Rankin was the first woman to be elected to the U.S. Congress in 1917, three years before the 19th Amendment was ratified giving women the right to vote in the United States.

The League holds consultative status with the United Nations which involves reciprocal information-sharing in an effort to solve the myriad of problems facing the world. SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Swarthmore College Peace Collection Accession of WILPF records cover the period from 1915-2000. The materials contained in the Swarthmore Accession were originally sent from the Geneva headquarters of WILPF to the Swarthmore College Peace Collection and were housed there for many years prior to being sent to the University of Colorado at Boulder Archives. The collection is divided into six main categories: ***International Executive Committee, WILPF Headquarters, International Triennial Congresses, National Sections/Country Files, Topics, and Publications***. The organizational structure utilized by staff members of the Swarthmore College Peace Collection was retained for the most part. One change is that the Elizabeth Fehrer, U.N. Representative for WILPF, papers were separated from the collection with the approval of Ms. Fehrer's estate. The Fehrer papers housed at the UCB Archives are only 1% of her papers; the remainder is housed at the United Nations with a few having been retained by the Swarthmore College Peace Collection.

The ***International Executive Committee*** files are divided into four sub-categories. ***Correspondence*** covers a variety of topics relating to the years 1920-1995 and includes undated material. The materials covering Camille Drevet and Edith Pye's voyage to China during the late 1920s has been kept separate. ***International Executive Committee Meetings*** contains documentation for IEC meetings held between the years 1963 and 1991. ***Resolutions and Statements*** contain resolutions and statements, in draft and final forms, for the years 1920-1995. ***International Executive Committee Meeting Minutes*** cover IEC meeting minutes for the years 1920 through 1977 with several years annotated by Emily Balch.

The ***WILPF Headquarters*** files are sub-divided into ten categories. ***General*** contains an early 1900s guest book for the Maison Internationale and information on the expulsion of Camille Drevet in 1933. ***Constitution*** contains revisions to the constitution for the years 1924 through 1985. ***Meetings*** contains information on the International Headquarters Advisory Council Meeting for the years 1939-1942 as well as the International Joint Chairmen Minutes for 1945. ***Lists*** holds member mailing lists and, in some cases, member lists for various League meetings covering the years 1928-1981 and some undated materials. ***Finances*** contains financial information including annual financial statements and fundraising goals and strategies for the years 1920-1987. It also contains financial information related specifically to the *Pax International* publication, the operations of the Maison Internationale and the Jane Addams International Peace Fund. ***Form Letters*** covers the years 1919-1998 and contains letters drafted on WILPF letterhead addressed to Executive Committee members and National Sections. ***Literature*** contains various pamphlets dated from 1920-1993 relating to WILPF and issues of concern to the organization. Pamphlets written by individuals indirectly associated with the organization on topics of mutual concern can also be found here. ***Miscellaneous*** should be consulted for any materials the researcher is seeking but is unable to locate elsewhere in the collection. It is virtually impossible to briefly list what can be found here. Many of the items are undated or were separated from other documents. ***Miscellaneous*** covers the years 1920-2000 with some undated materials as well. ***Releases*** contain documents that were made public in an effort to educate a wide audience on issues of importance and, at times were utilized to make WILPF's activities known. ***Releases*** covers the years 1920-1994. ***Reports*** cover the years 1920-1998 including some undated material. The topics covered are wide-ranging (e.g. International Traffic in and Manufacture of Arms & Munitions) and the reports are written by people both within and outside of WILPF.

The ***International Triennial Congresses*** files include materials from each of the Congresses for the years 1915-1992, including the inaugural Congress in 1915 and the 50th Anniversary Congress

in 1965. *Congress Reports* contains bound reports for the 1919-1971 meetings. *Circular Letters* contains newsletters drafted by and sent from headquarters to members and covers the years 1941-1972. *International Summer Schools/G. Baer Seminars* cover the years 1921 through 1993.

The *National Sections and Country Files* contain information from, and relating to, the 48 sections of WILPF based on every continent. While the years covered vary widely from section to section, the timeframe ranges from the early 1900s through the late 1990s.

The *Topics* files contain five subdivisions. *WILPF Committees/Commissions* contains information relating to six committees focusing on specific topics of interest to the League including scientific warfare, people without nationality, economics, and minorities. The years covered range from 1915-1973. *Disarmament* covers the Stop the Arms Race (S.T.A.R.) Campaign during the 1980s. *WILPF History* includes a history of the organization written by Gertrude Bussey as well as a pamphlet in draft form about WILPF. *Seminars, Conferences and Campaigns* contains information on a wide variety of events held during the years 1918-1986. The events were primarily those in which WILPF was a participant rather than events which the organization originated. *Nobel Prize* contains documents relating to Jane Addams' receipt of the award in 1932.

The *Publications* files are comprised solely of WILPF publications dated from 1915-1996. Publications include Pax International/Pax et Libertas as well as those from Egypt, France, Great Britain, Japan, The Netherlands, Sweden, and Switzerland. In addition, publications by the International Committee of Women for Permanent Peace and the United Nations can be found.
